Mayor Barrett reported that the matching check from the Division of Justice JAG Grant had been received for the 1917-1918 PRO Officer budget. The other half had been paid from the city's General Fund budget, but will be reimbursed from the Putnam County Board of Education.

The Mayor said that USDA application for the new sewer plant was on hold due to the government shut-down.

<u>Wastewater System/Treatment Plant Report:</u> John Hodges reported that the ammonia reading for December was 18.8 mg/L, and the reading for last year was 29.4 mg/L.
